

Exhibits to be made up on the premises.

- 2 Vase of five stems any rose(s)
- 3 One stem of a cluster flowered rose (floribunda or shrub)
- 4 Three stems of flowering shrub
- 5 Three pompon dahlias (not exceeding 52mm diameter)
- 6 Three small decorative dahlias (102-170mm diameter)
- 7 Three medium decorative dahlias (152-220mm diameter)
- 8 Three small cactus or semi-cactus dahlias (102-170mm diameter)
- 9 Three medium cactus or semi-cactus dahlias (152-220 mm diameter)
- 10 Three miniature ball dahlias (not exceeding 115mm diameter)
- 11 Three miniature decorative dahlias (not exceeding 115mm diameter)
- 12 Five blooms of any other dahlia not scheduled
- 13 Seven stems of sweet peas
- 14 Five stems of any other flower one variety grown from seed in last twelve months
- 15 Five stems of any other perennial flower one variety
- 16 Six stems of hardy herbaceous perennials more than one variety
- 17 One spike of gladiolus
- 18 One stem of any other flower not scheduled its own foliage allowed
- 19 One foliage, succulent or cactus plant in a pot (max pot size 225mm/9")
- 20 One flowering fuchsia in a pot (max pot size 225mm/9")
- 21 An orchid in a pot (max pot size 225mm/9")
- 22 Any other flowering plant in a pot (max pot size 225mm/9")
- 23 Twelve stems of any mixed herbs four varieties or more
- 24 One hosta leaf staged in your own container

Dundee cake

225g/8oz butter 50g/2oz chopped mixed peel 225g/8oz caster sugar 125g/4oz currants 225g/8oz plain flour, sifted 125g/4oz sultanas 4 large eggs 125g/4oz seedless raisins Finely grated rind 1 small lemon 50g/2oz ground almonds Finely grated rind 1 small orange 50g/2oz blanched or split almonds

Grease and line base and sides of a 20cm (8") approx. tin.

Set oven at 150°C or 300°F or Gas Mark 2.

Follow creaming method. Add grated rinds and ground almonds before adding flour and dried fruit. Place in tin and decorate with nuts.

Bake for 1½ hours.

- While the committee will endeavour to safeguard exhibits, no responsibility can be taken for any loss or damage to any property of the exhibitor.
- Entry forms, accompanied by the entrance fees, should reach the Show Entry Secretary (address on page 2) or a Committee Member before 6.00 pm on Thursday 5th September or be taken to the Village Hall between 6.00 and 8.00 pm on Thursday 5th September (late entry forms may not be accepted).
- All exhibits in Section A, G, and H must have been grown in the exhibitor's own garden or greenhouse, except where otherwise stated. Pot and container plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least three months. In other sections exhibits must have been made or preserved, and photographs taken, by the exhibitor.
- The Hall will be open for the receipt of exhibits for staging on Friday 6th September between 6.30 and 7.30 pm and on **Saturday morning from**8.30 am until 10.45 am, when the Hall will be closed for judging. No latitude will be allowed.
- 6 Exhibits not conforming to the schedule will be disqualified.
- Any complaints to be registered with the Chairman by 3.00 pm on the day of the Show.
- The Committee shall be empowered to settle any matter which may arise and which the Rules do not cover.
- 9 Prize money and trophies, etc. may be collected from the Treasurer at the Hall between 3.15 and 3.30 pm.
- 10 Exhibits should not be removed before 3.15 pm. Exhibitors are invited to leave any of their exhibits for sale, to assist the Society's funds. Please mark exhibits if not for sale.
- All trophies remain the property of the Bardsey Horticultural Society. Winners may hold them until 21 days prior to the next Annual Show, when they should be delivered to Debbie Reed, Half Acre House, Blackmoor Lane, Bardsey LS17 9DY Tel: 01937 573427. The holder shall be required to sign a receipt and shall be responsible for the trophy whilst in his/her possession. If loss or damage occurs, the holder must notify the Society immediately. The engraving of trophies has been discontinued.
